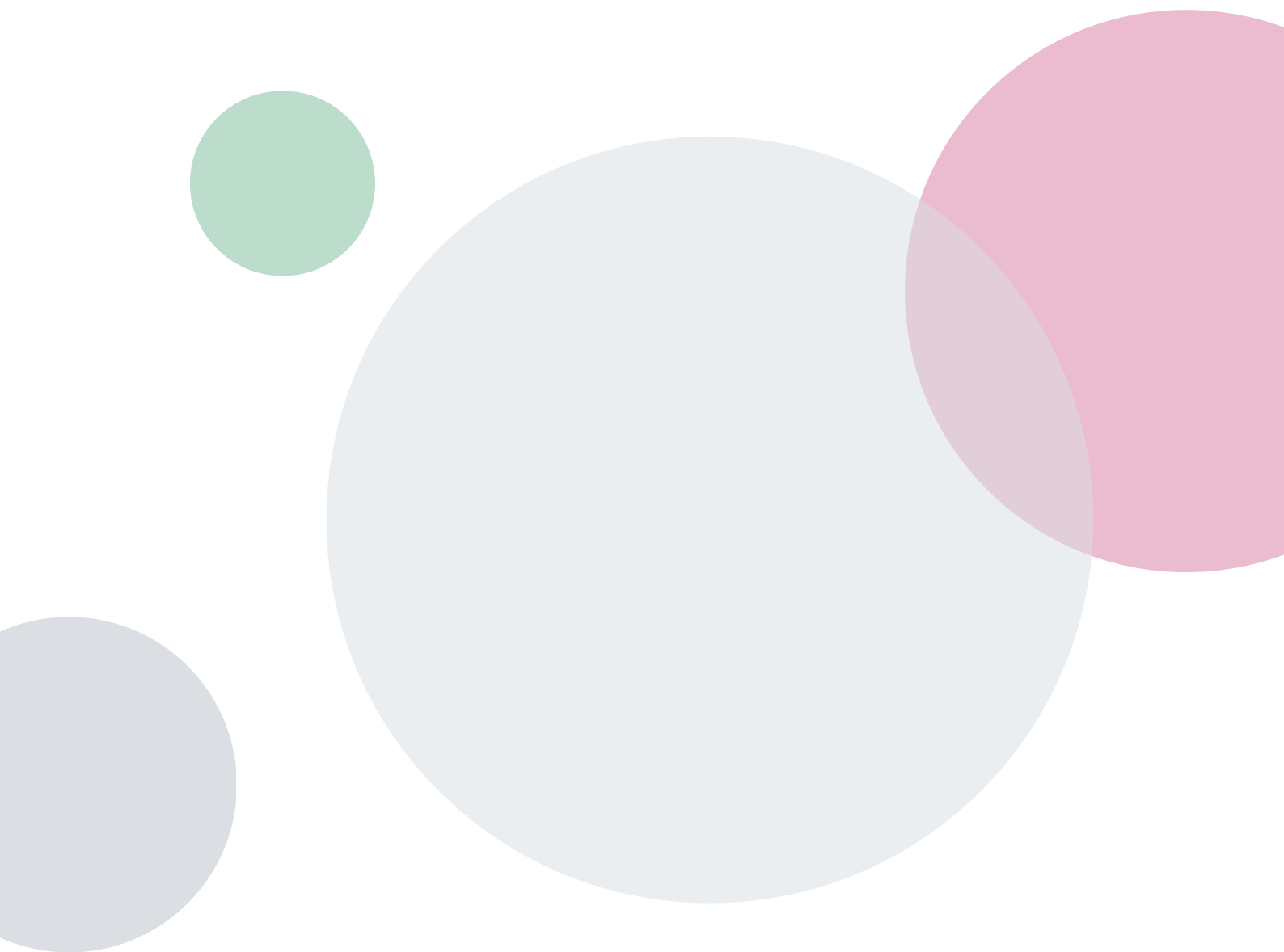

HOW TO APPLY



Audition Date: Thursday 9th October 2025

Between 12.15pm and 2.15pm

Candidates will be notified of the specific time of their audition

Application Deadline: Friday 26th September 2025

WHAT TO EXPECT

The audition process consists of:

An ice-breaker followed by a group workshop where candidates will take part in drama activities. This then leads to an individual audition, where each candidate must prepare:

Drama

TWO contrasting pieces of their choice, 1 - 2 minutes long, of a published playscript. Candidates should be ready to take direction during their audition.

Dance

A one minute dance routine of any style of Dance.

Musical theatre

A 1 minute verse and chorus from a Musical Theatre number. Musical Theatre auditionees also need to prepare the two piece for the Drama audition.

Design

A 5 minute talk on their experience and interest in design.

Please note: *Dance and Musical Theatre auditionees are asked to bring a backing track on a memory stick or mobile device.*

What to Submit

Each candidate must submit the following by the deadline:

- A written record (maximum one A4 page) detailing any drama examinations taken and production involvement both inside and outside school.

This information helps us learn more about each candidate but does not form part of the assessment.

Please do not send DVDs, certificates, photographs, or references.
